Dealing with Alcohol-Related Harm and the Night Time Economy

Presented by Associate Professor Peter Miller, School of Psychology, Deakin University, Australia

Peter Miller is a Principal Research Fellow at the School of Psychology, Deakin University. Peter has recently completed two of the largest studies ever conducted into licensed venues, comparing six Australian cities over three years and talking to more than 10,000 patrons. His research includes involvement in the Geelong and Newcastle studies that have measured the effectiveness of alcohol-related crime prevention measures in these areas. Peter is an executive board member of the International Society of Addiction Journal Editors and the National Alliance for Action on Alcohol. He is also the Commissioning Editor of the journal *Addiction*.

The Locally Specific Impacts of Alcohol Outlet Density in the North Island of New Zealand 2006–2011

Dr Gordon will discuss recently released research on the local impacts of alcohol outlet density in the North Island of New Zealand during the years 2006–2011. Craig will be discussing the impacts that the density of alcohol outlets can have in terms of social harms such as police events and motor vehicle accidents.
